Sherry Salant featured in Rural Missouri Magazine

Artist creates unique pieces using alcohol ink

...about her." Sherry says, "I saw the two words, 'alcohol ink'...

the late 1960s, my sister and I actually stayed with Benson and his wife at their home in Kansas City, which is now a state historic site," Sherry says. "I was more drawn to photography at the time, so I would take my Kodak Brownie camera around with me everywhere."

Sherry had recently retired from a 27-year career as a high school journalism teacher when she found alcohol ink. She had been taking plenty of in-person and YouTube classes to learn more about fine art, but the style was new. Bound and determined to learn more, Sherry ventured out to the normal big box stores in search of the ink.

"They all said they had never heard of it and didn't have any," she says. "Turns out they all did, just in their scrapbooking department, not in the fine art supplies."

Sherry was able to find one book on alcohol ink, but not much else online. She bought the products and began learning through trial and error. "It's a Catch-22 because if lots of people are painting in that style, they can teach you what to do," the Cuivre River Electric Cooperative member says. "But the good thing is if hardly anyone's doing it, you get to create your own style, and that's what I did."

The ink for the paintings is mixed with rubbing alcohol that is at least 91% concentrated to create the alcohol ink. Instead of being applied to the canvas with a brush, it is instead dripped down onto a flat surface. The ink is fluid and does not stay where it lands, ensuring artists won't have much luck penciling out their painting first.

The free-flowing ink dries fast so the artist must work quickly. As Sherry drips different colors of ink onto canvas, she might lift the canvas up to move the ink around. She uses tools such as brushes, cotton swabs, stencils or stampers to have the desired manipulation of what she's painting. If she wants a sunburst effect on a part of the painting, she'll pull out a straw and blow straight down on the area, instantly transforming the color spot to a shimmering sun. Air compressors, canned air and more are also used to get the perfect finished product.

Sherry has plenty of her art on display at H-art and Soul, including many paintings of St. Louis landmarks such as the Gateway Arch, Fabulous Fox Theater and Saint Louis Zoo. She also showcases her photography, scarves, rocks and other pieces on-site along with works by a handful of other Missouri artists. Her art is part of the Buy Missouri program as well. Sherry doesn't do a lot of painting when she's in the gallery, instead opting to chat with her visitors.

"I've been a storyteller my whole life," she says. "And the thing that clicked with me the most is the story that is the connection between the artist and piece of art. When someone comes in and looks at a piece, I can tell them why I painted it the way I did. Why the title is what it is. What's the inspiration I had for that painting. And it makes a big difference, more people find a connection to art because of the stories."

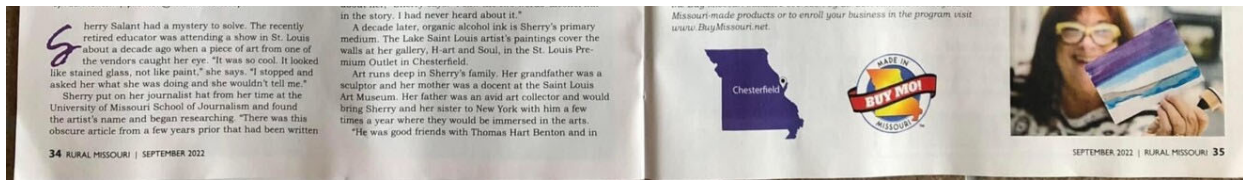

News from the studio of Stacy Heydt



Things are hopping for me right now. Here's a list of happenings...

I'm in my 2nd year of teaching art to 6-11 year olds at Spiva's Creation Station. It's once a week on Tuesday afternoons for the Spiva Art Gallery in Joplin. We will be moving into the new art complex in November.

The tapestry "Blocks, Beads & a Bird" will be included in their Membership show in November.

I have a piece in the ArtCentral Small Works Membership show at the Hyde House Gallery in Carthage and another piece in their rotating show that travels throughout the city.

Urban Art Gallery has asked me to place several pieces in their gallery in Joplin. I've already sold several items my 1st night.

The Joplin Library has an exhibit starting November 1st called The Eyes Have It. My A Brown-EYED Susan piece is going into that exhibit.

In September, the executive director of the chamber of commerce for the city of Carl Junction asked me to create a project focusing on a piece of the city's history as a make and take project for their Bluegrass Festival. I created needle felted ornament set... a mamma & baby elephant to commemorate the fossils found in their city. Yes, North America did have elephants that lived in the forests from Canada to at least southern Missouri. However, some folks said they were wooly mammoths which were here too, these remains are scientifically classified as American Elephants. Of course, they were made of grey alpaca fiber and a big hit at the Kid's Art Tent. I used a quartz

stone for the tusk on the mamma & a heart bead on the baby. So cute.

I will be entering my Werifesteria piece in a juried showing in Kansas City. Keep your fingers crossed that it is accepted.

There will be an artist's reception for each event.

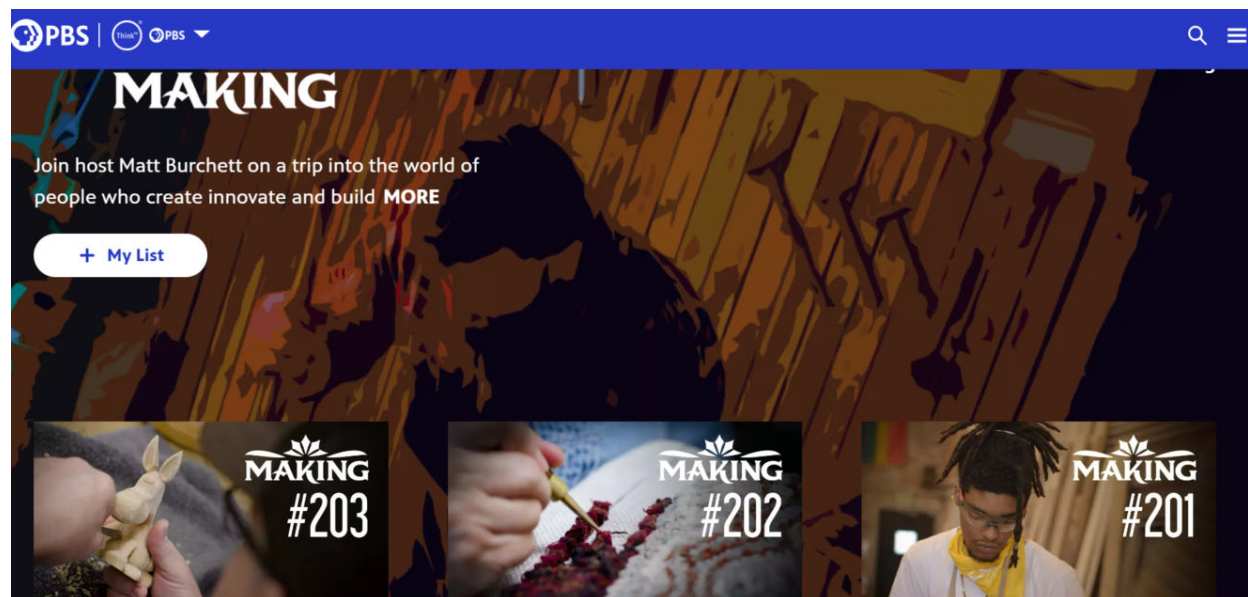

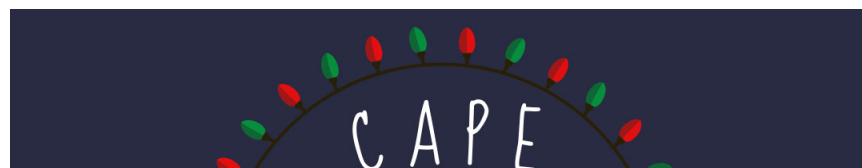

CAPE GIRARDEAU, MO— The Arts Council of Southeast Missouri, in collaboration with Cape County, is excited to announce a new holiday experience, 35 years in the making: The Cape Light Festival. So many of us can trace our favorite memories back to the magic of the Christmas season. The vibrant, open sky with its early-onset evenings. Children, pointing and laughing in wonder and delight at colorful roadside displays. Parents, marveling and reminiscing about fond memories, hearts alight, as Christmas tunes drift through the air. Warm color and soft light saturating the atmosphere.

For Information about Best of Missouri Hands visit our website: BestofMissouriHands.org Best of Missouri Hands Juried Artists are eligible to participate in events specifically for juried members. They are provided an individual

page on our website and wear our juried member badge at art shows and other events. They use juried member stickers on their items and display the juried member banner in their show booths. Since part of our mission is education, we ask juried members to participate in educational endeavors, both for the public and for other members.

Our primary educational program is the Visiting Artist Presentation. This program traditionally sends juried artists into schools for classroom presentations. When in-person visits aren't feasible, teachers and artists can arrange for Zoom presentations. Artists show samples of their work and talk about their process. The artist will demonstrate a skill or technique used in creating their art, and sometimes bring a project for the students to complete. They talk about how they decided to become an artist, the training involved, what it's like, and how they sell their work.

Presentations are made in art rooms with classes from kindergarten through 12th grade. The length of the talk is usually one art period. Visits are also available for senior and retirement centers.

Juried Artists are artisans who have developed their craft beyond mere competence of technique to a high standard of quality.

Part of the Best of Missouri Hands mission is education. We ask Juried Members to participate in educational endeavors, such as our Visiting Artist Program. This program sends juried artists into schools for classroom presentations. When in-person visits aren't feasible, teachers can arrange for Zoom presentations. Artists will show samples of their work and talk about their process. Sometimes they bring a project for students to complete.

Each year, The Best of Missouri Hands offers a \$500 Professional Development Grant. The grant is available to both General and Juried Members to promote continuing education by providing additional resources to advance the study of a member's chosen artistic medium(s).

How could this grant help you? The funds are available for

- Workshops in your medium
- New equipment
- Classes in marketing and branding your art
- Just about anything else that will help you advance your artistic skills and opportunities

There are many options open to you. What have you wanted to do with your art that has been out of your reach – something that will open doors for you or allow you to become more marketable?

The application will ask you to explain in detail what the grant would pay for, how your art would be advanced through the use of the grant, what BOMH activities you have participated in, and how you plan to give back to BOMH after if you are successful in your application. Applications will then be reviewed by the Professional Development Grant committee.

The grant funds will be paid to the winner after completion of the activities for which the grant was awarded, and after the winner has reported back to the BOMH membership via an article written for the BOMH newsletter.
