





The ABC's of Folklore and Slang and A Visual Voice in the Wilderness by Deby Gilley


Deby's first book, The ABC's of Folklore and Slang, was published in 2020. This little book contains 26 of her linocuts that tell of the origin of familiar sayings.

SMALL BUSINESS FILING REQUIREMENT



SMALL BUSINESS FILING REQUIREMENT

Is your creative business operating as a **limited liability company (LLC)**? Take note: there's a new federal rule requiring most small businesses to file with the U.S. Treasury Department's Financial Crimes Enforcement Network (FinCEN). LLCs and other businesses must report information about their beneficial owners — the persons who ultimately own or control the company. Companies that were created before 2024 have until January 13, 2025 to file.

Those created in 2024 have 90 days after their incorporation to file. You don't need an attorney or an accountant to complete the form, and there is no filing fee. Find the

instructions and FAQs on the <u>FinCEN website</u>. The new rules are intended to combat money laundering, terrorism financing, organized crime, and other financial crimes.

- 1. Account with EntryThingy (free)
- 2. Four good quality jpg images of the work you wish to be juried. They must be between 200K & 3MB, and maximum 1920 pixels on the longest side
- 3. Descriptions with materials for each image SLIDE SHOW

I am writing to invite you to a **Best of Missouri Hands "On the Road-The World We Create" exhibit that will be at Columbia Art League in Columbia, MO.** This is an exhibit for 2-dimensional and 3-dimensional work with a subject manner spotlighting the world around you and creative processes. Just a simple look out of any window exposes architecture, design, nature, color theory, etc. The world can be as small as your neighborhood or as vast as the entire planet.

The exhibit will be on display **April 22, 2025, through May 8, 2025.** Columbia Art League is open Tuesday through Friday from 11:30 am to 6pm and Saturday from 11am to 5pm. An **opening reception** and awards ceremony will be held on **April 25th.**

Columbia Art League has graciously offered BOMH a three week exhibit window. We have an incredible opportunity to bring BOMH talent to the middle of Missouri. Each member can submit up to three pieces for display, with the understanding that space may dictate that not all submitted pieces will be hung. Each piece of artwork needs to be framed and ready to hang or display with a wire across the back. No sawtooth or triangle hangers will be allowed. Please make a mental note that this is a child friendly venue. Jewelry is allowed, but no locking cases are available, and pieces must be ready to display with stands, etc. Pedestals are available for 3-dimensional work.

Columbia Art League will be able to make sales on works and will only take a 35% commission. Size and weight restrictions are listed on the call for entry on Entrythingy.com. Columbia Art League is a beautiful space. Let's make sure to fill the space!



SEEKING VISITING ARTISTS FOR 2025

Learn more about the BOMH Visiting Artist Program

The goal of this program is for students to meet and learn about professional artists and their work. This may be a student's first exposure to actual artwork outside of a museum. Students regularly learn about other careers, and this program introduces them to the lives of working artists. Students view actual work up close and ask questions of the artist, developing a deeper understanding of the artist's life. Some students will go on to become professional artists themselves, and exposure to professional working artists provides a meaningful way for contemplating creative career choices. It helps deepen an appreciation for art as they become collectors of art in the future.

You must be a juried BOMH artist to apply for the Visiting Artist Program. Our artists are provided with a \$100 stipend for each visit approved and completed.

DEADLINE: February 15, 2025

The Best of Missouri Hands offers two grants of up to \$500 each annually. The grant is available to both General and Juried Members. The purpose of the grant is to promote continuing education by providing additional resources to advance the study of a member's chosen artistic medium(s).

The grant will be awarded by early March of each year and announced at the Annual Membership Meeting that spring.

If you are interested in applying for the grant, you should be thinking about what you would like to do with it. Is there a workshop you want to take in your medium? Do you want to travel abroad to learn about a technique native to that country? Do you need to purchase a new piece of equipment that will help you advance your skills and opportunities? How about taking classes in marketing and branding your art?

There are many options open to you. What have you wanted to do with your art that has been out of your reach - something that will open doors for you or allow you to become more marketable?
